The exhibition *Moltitudini* presents a body of works from 2022 in which the natural world remains at the centre of Marta Spagnoli's interests. In these works she intends to highlight both the invisible and indissoluble differences and the secret connections that exist between all living things. The human, animal, vegetable body is explored through a metaphoric language before coming back as space, place and figure (over a year ago, this topic has been introduced and explored in the exhibition *Earthly Body*, where the metaphorical juxtaposition of the bare body to the "naked" earth were an invitation to reconsider and re-establish the profound bond that links the primal matter of the earth to our physical form).

The new series Armor, consisting of 5 works painted with oil and ink on paper (72 x 102 cm each), is characterised by a texture of marks that entangles and incorporates vegetal structures like a capillary system - an intricate interlacing of blood or lymphatic ramifications capable of carrying nourishment from the centre to the extremities of a body: a natural filament that takes shape according to the artist's needs. In the works on paper, the artist imagines large and elementary shapes that resemble those of plants, consisting of ribbed and fibrous elements typical of plant-related organs or vegetables.

The images take shape through a peculiar pictorial process, emerging spontaneously and in a partially controlled way by means of a repeated and rhythmic gesture of pouring an emulsion of water and oil paints on a vertically placed sheet of paper. Roots, trunks, and stalks: the result is a sequence of pictorial interventions that recall the stems of many plants.

The multiplicity of illustrated fragments depicted in the *Portraits / Ritratti* series, commenced in 2020 and presented here with three new iterations, rounds up the unity of a body in spite of the diversities and autonomies of its parts, just like the relationship between an organism and its components, where organs, fibres and molecules autonomously contribute to creating unity. The detailed assembly of large patterns, weaves and textures, drawn largely with ink and a calligraphic pen, envelops the surface in a capillary way and characterizes the singularity of each body and the features of its patterned livery. The relationships and events that nourish human experience are sewn onto these bodies like a dress or a skin..

This teeming ensemble of veins radiates, suggesting the presence of a central and vital heart whose existence remains intangible, secret, and eternal.

Marta Spagnoli (Verona, 1994) lives and works in Venice. She graduated in Painting at the Academy of Fine Arts in Venice. Marta Spagnoli's artistic practice is mainly focused on painting and drawing. The main themes she approaches are centred around a study of the constant reciprocity between human experience, the animal kingdom and the environment that encompasses them.
