He has also participated in numerous group exhibitions in Italy and abroad, including the Venice, Istanbul and Gwanjiu Biennials.

He has travelled mainly in Europe, North America and Asia, also participating in artist residency programmes in the USA, including San Francisco, Boston and San Antonio, in New Delhi, India, in and Clisson, France.
