



LORIS CECCHINI

Loris Cecchini (1969) lives and works in Milan. One of the most prominent Italian artists on the international stage he has exhibited his works throughout the world with solo exhibitions in prestigious museums such as Palais de Tokyo in Paris, Musée d'Art Moderne de Saint-Étienne Métropole in Saint-Priest-en-Jarez, MoMA PS1 in New York, Shanghai Duolun MoMA of Shanghai, Museo Casal Solleric in Palma de Mallorca, Centro Galego de Arte Contemporánea in Santiago de Compostela, Kunstverein of Heidelberg, Centro per l'Arte Contemporanea Luigi Pecci in Prato and Fondazione Arnaldo Pomodoro in Milan.

Loris Cecchini has participated in numerous international exhibitions, including the 56th, 51st and 49th Venice Biennale, the 6th and the 9th Shanghai Biennale, the 15th and 13th Rome Quadrennial, the Taiwan Biennale in Taipei, the Valencia Biennale in Spain and the Biennale of Urbanism/Architecture (UABB) in Shenzhen, China.

Loris Cecchini has also taken part in several collective shows, including exhibitions at the Ludwig Museum in Cologne, PAC in Milan, Palazzo Fortuny in Venice, Macro Future in Rome, MART in Rovereto, London's Hayward Gallery, The Garage Centre for Contemporary Culture in Moscow, Palazzo delle Esposizioni in Rome, Musée d'Art Contemporain of Lyon, Shanghai's MOCA, the Deutsche Bank Kunsthalle in Berlin and others.

He has created various permanent and site-specific installations, particularly at Villa Celle in Pistoia and in the courtyard of Palazzo Strozzi in Florence, and at the Cornell Tech Building in New York.

Currently, he is working on a permanent sculpture for the city of Milan, at the Renzo Piano's former building of the Sole 24 Ore.

Additionally, a new installation will soon enter the permanent collection of the Quirinale. In June 2024, his solo exhibition titled "Leaps, Gaps and Overlapping Diagrams" will open at Ca' Rezzonico in Venice.



THE AIR BETWEEN THE LEAVES

The project for Palazzo Borromeo revolves around the theme of growth, the continual transformation of seasonal cycles, and the infinite variations of tonal sublimity within the organic mutability of surfaces and structures created by the artist.

The morphology that describes the general features of certain natural elements becomes a poetic premise for the creation of the image, suggesting and representing a phenomenal process but also mapping an emotional geography, expressed in saturated color topographies, where the dusty quality of the surface plays with the depth of the color thanks to the specific absorption of light, in a certain relation to the idea of the sublime.

Giordano Bruno said that only a man who is simultaneously a magician, philosopher, poet, and painter can hope to ascend and descend those same stairs that nature uses to create and change its force.

LAMINASCAPES



Laminascapes has been developed in two versions, in resin and in hand-formed Japanese paper and is based on the magnification of the Lamina's surface, the largest upper part of the leaves of plants, with the most diverse morphologies. The saturated colours that pervade the Laminascapes series, the red, orange and yellow colours enter into dialogue with the cycle of frescoes by Del Maestro dei Giochi present in the adjacent room of Palazzo Borromeo.

PRINCIPI E OF GROUPING



Principle of grouping. This work presents itself as a composite filamentary mass, in which the brass wire follows a sort of orbital order, while simultaneously cascading like a mass of coiffed hair; the structured geometry but totally open to chaos suggests an orbital dimension, in which the threads become vector form and where the singularity of the filament becomes a metaphor for energy in action, part of a single structure.

AIRBORNE



Airborne is a new steel sculpture that develops vertically on a large wall and demonstrates the artist's continuation of his research on self-generating modular systems made of different metals. An example of an instant installation that can be "continuously built": the modules create differentiated repetition, harmonious growth and minimal variation of the same element that gives rise to a fractal and rhizomatic system in which concepts of aesthetics, chemistry, engineering and anatomy overlap.

Airborne «cluster» of modules developes in a V shape, taking on an aerial form, suspended from the wall, reminiscent of the moving seeds of a dandelion or the movement of flocks, in a similar propagation strategy.

Loris Cecchini's artworks often revolve around the concept of metamorphosis, a potential transfiguration from one form to another. The relationship between the artist and the exhibition space as a place of coexistence is influential in the genesis of many of his works.

Surreal biological landscapes, modular suspended installations, lattice structures, and molecular forms are flexible not only in their occupation of the surrounding space but also in their development; the works are almost always potentially open to further elaboration, as if they were themselves an expansive and distributive substance.
